BOCA RATON, FLORIDA

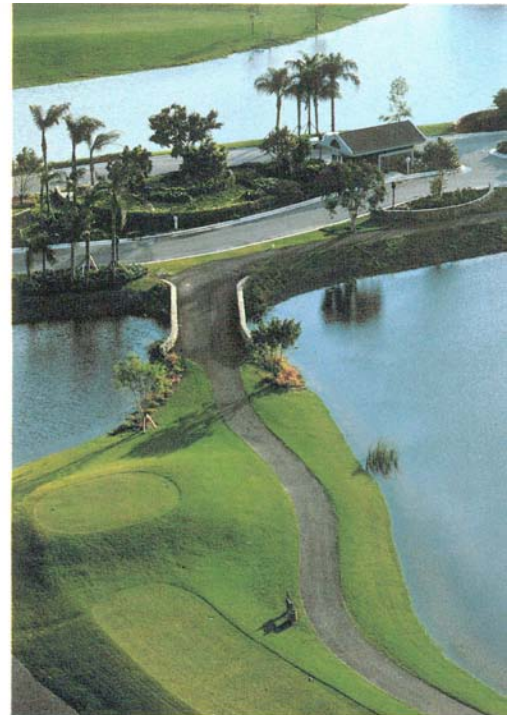
The success of Stonebridge Golf and Country Club illustrates the advantages of maintaining a strong architectural theme throughout the site features and amenities of a residential community.

Stonebridge Golf and Country Club is a community of 398 single-family estate homes, built on the site of an existing golf course west of Boca Raton. In addition to master planning, site planning and entry design services, Urban Design Kilday Studios designed the conceptual layout of the totally rebuilt 18-hole golf course, and assisted in obtaining required governmental approvals for this award-winning community.

The curvilinear concept of the main entry design at Stonebridge evokes a sense of history upon arrival in the community. The entry structures, which convey the appearance of old stone construction, are complemented by huge native trees relocated from elsewhere on site. Bridges, the guardhouse, sign walls and fence columns are faced with North Carolina river rock.

This theme is carried into the site interior in the architecture of the 25,000-square-foot clubhouse and in the design of the 18th hole Stonebridge finale. The community's master plan allows all homes to be sited with golf or lake frontage, creating a comprehensive open space system.

In addition to the golf course which has hosted such events as the LPGA Oldsmobile Classic and the ST. Jude Charity Classic, other major amenities in the community include a world class golf practice facility, and a community pool and tennis club.
