

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF POLO AND HALL OF FAME

LAKE WORTH, FLORIDA

Urban Design Kilday Studios was contracted by the Museum of Polo to perform due diligence investigation and seek governmental approvals needed to construct a museum and hall of fame in western Lake Worth. The Museum began as a vision of four polo players, H. Jeremy Chisholm, Phillip L. B. Iglehart, Leverett S. Miller, and George C. Sherman, Jr., who had dreamed of establishing a place to honor and preserve the history of the sport.

Services provided by UDKS included working with the Board of Directors, Museum staff and the project architect and engineer to develop a site layout for the museum and hall of fame building and associated parking. Major goals were to maximize opportunities for visibility and future expansion, and minimize the impact of public use on the adjacent residential communities.

Services provided included the preparation of a feasibility analysis regarding land use and zoning and a confirmation of the applicable processes. Meetings with Palm Beach County staff were held to identify and resolve development issues. Other tasks included development of the phased site layout plan. UDKS also prepared the necessary applications, coordinated the approvals and represented the project during the public hearing and final site plan approval processes.
