The development of a large-scale, multi-phase community requires particular insight into the long-term needs of the community's residents, as well as the ability to anticipate and respond to the changing demands of the marketplace over the years. The success of PGA National is an example of such long-term vision.

This large-scale, residential, mixed-use community has evolved into one of the most significant landmarks in Northern Palm Beach County, and is the home of both the Professional Golfers Association and the United States Croquet Association. Urban Design Kilday Studios' role in PGA's evolution has included master planning, site planning, landscape architecture and the securing of governmental approvals.

Today, PGA National includes a 146,000 sq. ft. shopping plaza with stores, boutiques and restaurants; seven miles of biking and jogging trails; neighborhood parks; a 240-acre nature preserve that is home to more than 20 species of birds; and a wide variety of product types including single and multi-family homes, patio homes, club cottages, golf villas and townhomes. Amenities include five golf courses, 19 clay tennis courts, community pools, one of the largest croquet complexes in the nation with five tournament level fields, and a AAA four-diamond resort hotel.
